Off - Site Service Locations:

Site 1: Meals on Wheels @Goodman Community Center

- Description of Service Work: Students will be cleaning the carrier bags that are used to transport the meals and decorating lunch bags that the food will go in.
- Number of Student Volunteer Spots: 25

Site 2: Aldo Leopold Nature Center

- Description of Service Work: The group will be helping with upkeep of the Longenecker Horticultural Gardens. Located on 35 acres north of the Visitor Center, this living museum features approximately 4,000 specimens composed of over 2,600 kinds of trees, shrubs, and vines organized by plant group and laid out in a park-like setting. It is Wisconsin's largest and most comprehensive collection of woody plants. Work activities may include weeding, mulching specimens and/or invasive species removal.

Site 3: UW-Madison Arboretum

Located on 35 acres north of the Visitor Center, this living museum features approximately 4,000 specimens composed of over 2,600 kinds of trees, shrubs, and vines organized by plant group and laid out in a park like setting. It is Wisconsin's largest and most comprehensive collection of woody plants. Work activities may include weeding, mulching specimens and/or invasive species removal.

Site 4: Ronald McDonald House - Madison

In addition to lodging, we also provide laundry services, 3 meals a day, snacks, and fun common

rooms at no cost to families who stay with us. Students will be doing a variety of indoor cleaning and outdoor pick-up chores to make our House clean and welcoming. Students may also bake cookies or other sweet treats while here.

The park hosts workshops and public events, and has both modern and rustic spaces available for private rentals. Volunteers will be doing garden work and/or natural areas work (pulling plants, piling brush)
