Wisconsin FFA Alumni & Supporters 44th Annual Convention Registration Opening Soon

It is now just about 4 months until we gather for our annual Wisconsin FFA Alumni & Supporters convention. There are a lot of great events being planned and you will want to be sure to attend.

There were some changes that needed to be made because the original hotel is now undergoing renovations and will not have enough rooms available, so we have been able to secure the KI Center and Hyatt Regency in Green Bay. Convention will be held on February 2 & 3, 2024 at 333 Main St in Green Bay.

General notes of information available thus far include:

- Registration can be found at https://www.wisconsinaged.org/alumni-state-convention and will close on December 31, 2023. (Due to supply chain shortages, etc. we must have final numbers to ensure that we can meet our expectations of excellence.) We would sincerely appreciate all registrations that will be mailed to please have them in the mail by December 20th in order to ensure their receipt to the treasurer by the closing date.
- Hotel accommodations are the responsibility of each individual attending. Rooms are blocked currently but will be released after January 2, 2023. Hotel Reservations may be made at https://www.hyatt.com/en-US/group-booking/GRBRG/G-FFAA

- Room rates are \$ 98 for a single person and \$ 20 for each additional guest, plus taxes.
- Please note that these are all suites so they have extra space for a kitchenette, and there are king or 2 queen options. The living area also has a pullout sofa option.

Friday Afternoon Activities Include:

- Registration begins at 11 AM.
- Auction items, baskets, etc. may be turned in at the main registration area starting at noon. We would appreciate any donations.
- There is a tour option available that will leave at noon to tour the Green Bay Southwest Ag Department. The group will then head to Title Town for the classic Packers tour at Lambeau Field, which will be followed by a self-guided tour of Hinterland Brewery, which includes a complimentary beer. The tour has a 60-person maximum, so individuals are encouraged to register early, as it is first come, first serve in the registration process. Cost of the tour is \$ 60 and includes busing and all tour costs.
- For those who do not want to participate in the tour on Friday afternoon, something new this year will be a make and take option for individuals. There are two different workshops being planned.
- Option 1 Succulent Bowl /glass art project drop-in session from 1- 4 PM. People can stop in any time from 1 - 3 to begin, but they need 1 hour to do the activity. The cost is \$25.00. There is a minimum of 20 participants or it would be cancelled, and due to supplies, etc. there is a maximum of 40.
- Option 2 Wood Flower arrangement to make. This is also a drop-in session running from 1 to 4. The cost is \$10.00, with no minimum participants but a maximum of 50.
- Friday night's activities will feature a pasta buffet and live auction, and DJ entertainment. This is a great chance to network with other chapters and share ideas as well.

Saturday is packed full of Activities!

- Saturday morning will kick off with breakfast and the opening session, followed by meetings of the various individual sections and larger convention planning groups.
- Something new this year is a Past Leaders recognition event. There will be additional information coming, but the committee is trying to reach all of the past FFA Alumni council leadership and past state FFA officers from the hosting sections of 6, 8, 9 and is offering a special event for them kicking off with the luncheon.

- Following lunch, the association will hold its annual meeting where a new vice president will be elected and other business is conducted. Next on the agenda are numerous workshop opportunities. These options can be found further in the newsletter.
- The Wisconsin FFA State Officer team will once again offer their **Reflections** program prior to the banquet Saturday evening. This is always very inspirational.
