### First Female to Serve as National FFA Advisor and Board Chair

These are very familiar words to FFA members and advisors as officers of the organization participate in the Official Opening Ceremonies. I have had the opportunity to share in that ceremony many times on a chapter and state level. However, I never imagined that at a point in my life I would say those words as the National FFA Advisor.



What many may not know is National FFA is one of the few organizations that has a Federal Charter, which was granted in 1950. To make a long story short, National FFA was the only chartered organization that has stipulations within the charter that mandated the U.S. Department of Education selects or approves a majority of its members of the board of directors, including the national advisor/board chair and national executive secretary.

Fast forward to November 2019. Changes in the Federal Charter allowed the positions of National FFA Advisor/Board Chair and the National FFA Executive Secretary to be elected from a wider pool of qualified, dedicated candidates. After a lengthy process, I was selected as the National FFA Executive Secretary and performed my duties in this role until May 2022 when I also started serving as the Interim National FFA Advisor, becoming the first female to serve in this role.

Never would I have imagined the opportunity to serve in this role. With this came the responsibility to chair the upcoming National FFA Board of Directors meetings, work closely with National FFA CEO, Scott Stump, in discussions around key issues of the organization, and share a message on stage at the National FFA Convention among other responsibilities.

A wonderful coincidence is Cortney Zimmerman, my daughter, was also serving as the National FFA Central Region Vice President. We were the first daughter/mother duo to serve on the National FFA Board of Directors. Sitting across the table from Cortney during National FFA Board meetings and then participating in the National FFA Convention with her was a dream of a lifetime. I am so proud of what she has accomplished as an FFA member.

While I serve as National FFA Executive Secretary along side newly elected National FFA Advisor, Dr. Park, I continue to be humbled by the tremendous honor and experience of my service.

So the moral of the story is: You never know what opportunities might come your way. Don't let opportunities pass you by, take those moments and cherish them. As a young FFA member wearing a Pecatonica FFA jacket that was a few sizes too big, I had only dreamed of the things I could do in FFA.

# Star in Agribusiness - Cameron Pokorny

### Waupun FFA



As the owner and manager of Cam's Coop, Cameron makes all decisions related to finances, marketing, inventory, and sales for his business. What began with just a few egg-laying birds expanded as Cameron's passion for poultry grew. His business grew to 200 live birds, and he began to consider how he could use his agribusiness to help others. Cameron began donating eggs to his local food pantry and growing vegetables. Most recently in 2021, Cameron donated 220 pounds of produce, 155 broilers, and 2,200 dozen eggs to his local food pantry. Cameron's SAE has helped him decide to pursue a career in agricultural engineering, as he learned how much he enjoyed designing, building, and troubleshooting projects related to his poultry.

# Star in Agriscience - Wyatt Gotham

Spending time on his family's farm sparked Wyatt's interest in agriscience research. He developed a research project to determine if salt water could be filtered using various combinations of sheep wool, which earned him 5th Gold at the National Agriscience Fair. Wyatt shared that this project was what motivated him to continue his agriscience research SAE, later researching erosion techniques and organic fertilizers. Most recently, Wyatt determined if broiler chickens fed a ration of 50% cracked corn and 50% commercial broiler feed would have more tender meat than store bought chicken.



# Star Farmer - Brayden Peter

Brayden raises breeding and market show pigs on his family farm, Peter Family Show Pigs. He currently owns both sows and boars. Brayden has invested in improving the genetics of his show pigs and has seen this pay off at a variety of shows, including the Wisconsin State Fair. Beyond care and management of his herd, Brayden has learned about identifying when and how to give medications and managing breeding through artificial insemination.

# Star in Agricultural Placement - Luke Sprecher Sauk Prairie FFA

Luke started to work at Kevin Enge Farms after his neighbor asked if he would be interested in assisting to milk cows. When he first started working, he only milked cows and fed calves. Since then, his knowledge surrounding the dairy industry has not only increased, but he learned how to repair the milking equipment, tractors, and other pieces of machinery around the farm. Through Luke's management of the herd, he was able to improve the genetics within the herd and increase the profitability on the farm.

# New Auburn FFA: Tractor Restoration Project

New Auburn High School's Agriscience Department is central to the activities of the New Auburn FFA Chapter. In October of 2019 a team of FFA chapter members shared their enthusiastic request to restore a tractor and within weeks of their request a 1947 Minneapolis-Moline ZTU was donated as a project restoration tractor. Major work completed during this tractor restoration included a new ring gear and clutch; replacement fenders; replacement of a rear tire rim; new wiring harness; new gauges; new front tractor tires; and new steering joint.

Additional repairs included new air cleaner parts; generator rebuild; new belt replacements; oil filter; reupholstered seat; new decals; new battery; repairs on magneto; repairs on starter and condenser; replacement lights; replacement radiator; replacement battery cable, sediment bowl, fuel hose; and replacement solenoid.

In December of 2020 the New Auburn FFA Chapter was one of forty chapters from across the state to receive a Chapter Assistance Grant. These Chapter Assistance Grants were sponsored by the Foundation's Star Mission program and its sponsors: Alliant Energy Foundation, Armor Animal Health, Compeer Financial, Culver's, Investors Community Bank, Organic Valley/CROPP Cooperative, and Rural Mutual Insurance Company. This grant helped offset the tractor restoration project expenses.

Over the course of three years, the tractor restoration was accomplished. There was a number of businesses that contributed and assisted with the project including Hometown Repair of New Auburn, WI; NAPA Machine Shop of Rice Lake, WI; Noble's Tire Service, Inc. of Barron, WI; Red Cedar Collision Classics of Menomonie, WI; and Specialty Welding, LLC of New Auburn, WI.

Three years of work and time investment in the tractor project resulted in the final goal of a raffle tractor. New Auburn's chapter conducted a raffle in 2022 and began selling tickets at the New Auburn FFA Alumni Annual Dairy Breakfast held on June 4th, 2022. Official drawing of the FFA Fundraiser Raffle was held on October 7th, 2022 during the New Auburn Homecoming Football Game. Grand prize drawing went to Blake Rivard of Rice Lake, WI.









In reflection, the New Auburn FFA Chapter is thankful for the cooperation of the School District of New Auburn. Special recognition is given to Austin Rayburn, Technology Education Instructor, for his knowledgeable contribution towards the project. New Auburn FFA Alumni was actively involved at many different levels of the project including assisting FFA members with project repairs and assembly. Throughout the New Auburn community, along with surrounding communities, there has been a wide array of support. Shortly after the raffle drawing, New Auburn FFA Chapter was able to provide financial assistance to 15 New Auburn FFA members and 4 chaperones to the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana. Their attendance resulted in New Auburn FFA Chapter members being honored with eight National FFA Agriscience Fair awards. New Auburn's High School FFA Chapter is advised by Brenda J. Scheil.

New Auburn Agriscience students/FFA members shared their comments in regard to their work experience with the tractor restoration project:

Wyatt Gotham, a 2022 New Auburn High School Graduate, shared, "Inspiration for the FFA project tractor came from noticing tractor restoration projects from other chapters. A highpoint was hearing the tractor operate after the restoration was complete. Persistence is a word that will always stay with me as there is always some challenging points through the tractor restoration process."

New Auburn 8th grade FFA member, Spencer Glaser, responded with his thoughts. "I learned that when you place hard work into a challenging project, the restoration is well worth the effort. I appreciated hearing all of the positive comments when we displayed the tractor at the Hungry Hollow Show in Rice Lake, WI this past June."

Caleb Gotham, 2021-22 FFA Chapter President, stated, "My favorite part of rebuilding and restoring the tractor project was noticing progress and seeing the final product."

Another FFA member, Cole Ludwigson, shared his thoughts, "One of the highlights of restoring this tractor was working with fellow FFA members. It gave me a sense of teamwork. I learned a great deal about the importance of sanding, painting and finishing. I appreciate all of those who supported the raffle of our restored tractor project." Cole is a sophomore and rural agriscience student where his additional interests reside in his SAE of Beef Production.

Allison Moos, New Auburn FFA member, conveyed her thoughts. "We definitely experienced teamwork on our FFA tractor restoration project." Allison is a freshman and carries out work efforts in her SAE of Agriscience Research connected to Food Products & Processing Systems.


