General Information

State & National FFA Alumni & Supporters WLC Scholarship Awards

Scholarship awards are available to support Wisconsin FFA members participating in the Washington Leadership Conference. Award amounts will be dependent on funds at the national level each year. The National FFA Alumni Association typically provides funds for one scholarship to each state for every 500 FFA Alumni members.

Only FFA chapters who have active FFA Alumni Chapters (10 members or more) that have submitted paid membership for the membership year are eligible for this scholarship. Interested FFA members (maximum number of two applicants per chapter) must complete the WLC Scholarship Application form, which <u>must be typed</u>, and submit it by <u>January 15</u> to the Wisconsin FFA Center.

FFA Alumni Scholarships are not transferable to another student after the paperwork has been sent to the National FFA Alumni. If a recipient is unable to attend and notifies the Wisconsin FFA Alumni before paperwork has been sent to Nationals, the scholarship will be issued to the next eligible alternate. If the notification is given after paperwork has been sent in, the scholarship cannot be awarded. Only one student from each chapter can be awarded the scholarship each year.

Applications will be evaluated using the scoring rubric. The top individual from each section will receive a scholarship, provided the application receives a minimum score. The remaining scholarships will be awarded based on rankings regardless of section.

Scholarship recipients will receive a reimbursement of funds only after proof of payment for WLC has been received by the Wisconsin FFA Alumni. Proof of paid conference expenses can be sent to execdir@wisconsinffaalumni.org. Reimbursements/Scholarships will only be given out to the recipients during the calendar year of the scholarship being received and must be submitted by September 30.

Interest in the FFA Washington Leadership Conference has grown.

WLC trains FFA members to make a positive impact in their school, local community, state, and country. It strives to have participating FFA members take their leadership skills to the highest level by learning to solve local problems and build relationships; developing character; and living to serve. The goal of the Wisconsin FFA Alumni WLC Scholarship Program is to reward FFA members who are developing their leadership skills by assisting them to participate in this premier youth leadership development program. We want to select Wisconsin FFA members who have (a) been using opportunities in FFA to build their leadership skills, (b) have been practicing those skills to solve problems in their chapter and community, and (c) who will commit to using the skills gained in WLC to apply to challenges when they return.

The application is the only means we have to evaluate those qualities of applicants. It is your responsibility to communicate that information clearly on this application.

Effectively communicating, or selling your qualities and accomplishments is one measure of your leadership. We offer the following suggestions to improve the effectiveness of your application.

- In the limited space available concentrate on communicating to the selection committee your commitment to learning to be a leader. Remember that quality is more important than quantity—think about the strongest points that will demonstrate to those evaluating applications that you have been serious about developing your leadership skills. Examples may include, but are not limited to the following:
 - o Serving as an officer or on a committee and accomplishing goals.
- o Participating in FFA leadership development programs such as Leadership Workshop, Half-Time, conferences; LDEs and CDEs. We realize the opportunity to participate in area and state activities varies between schools. We are interested in learning how you have been involved and what you have accomplished with what is available to you.
 - o Maintaining a respectable academic record and balance in high school and community activities.
 - o Awards and recognition that represent hard work and accomplishment of goals.
- Become familiar with the Washington Leadership Conference by checking the National FFA web site or printed material about the program and think about what you would hope to gain by participating, both personally and in your FFA chapter and community after returning from WLC—a problem that you would plan to provide leadership in solving.
- Please do not forget to communicate your interactions with your alumni chapter. After all, the reason that you are eligible to complete this scholarship application is because of your chapter.
